

In Ohio's Backyard: Spiders

An extensive appendix section includes six lesson plans for teachers, a glossary, a pronunciation guide, and a reading list. The six main chapters include information about the relationship of spiders to people, the life history, biology, and identification of spiders, and a key to families.

Spiders are a fascinating group of organisms familiar to everyone, both young and old. There are 3700 species of spiders known in North America north of Mexico, and about 600 of those species can be found in Ohio. Representatives of 38 families of spiders occur within Ohio, occupying all terrestrial (land) Ohio habitats. Spiders are very important in controlling the populations of other invertebrates, and serve as a food source for many vertebrates (e.g. birds, and small mammals). This book provides answers to many of the questions you might have about spiders, and will answer many others you never thought to ask.
