A quick look at the brief table of contents (p. v.) looks like most science texts with its chapter headings: "About Science," "Particles of Matter," "Elements of Chemistry," "Subatomic Particles," and so on. A (conceptual) language and tradition constitutes the world, and our (conceptual) "openness to the world" (ibid, p.155). This means that the condition for access to the world is a clear subject-object split, and a clear split between content and the way the [Show full abstract] content is presented. The philosophy of chemistry is a small but growing cottage industry. Because of this book's narrow focus, it does not provide a comprehensive introduction to the field.
