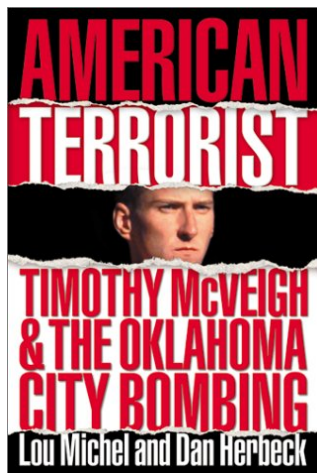

The bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City on April 19, 1995 was the deadliest act of homegrown terrorism in U.S. history, resulting in the deaths of 168 people. On the morning of April 19, 1995, an ex-Army soldier and security guard named Timothy McVeigh parked a rented Ryder truck in front of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in downtown Oklahoma City. He was about to commit mass murder. Inside the vehicle was a powerful bomb made out of a deadly cocktail of agricultural fertilizer, diesel fuel, and other chemicals. McVeigh got out, locked the door, and headed towards his getaway car. He ignited one timed fuse, then another. At precisely 9:02 a.m., the bomb exploded. Within moments, the surrounding area looked like a war zone. McVeigh provided firsthand accounts of the bombing during two days of interviews with Jones in September of 1995. He talked about filling the truck with explosive fertilizer and trying to look conspicuous after the bomb hit. He told Jones that he didn't have the resources to conduct a "solo war" and was convinced he "could have gotten away clean from this and continued on if I had anywhere to go." In the polygraph interview, McVeigh said when he was pulled over by an Oklahoma highway trooper shortly after the bombing for not displaying a license plate on his car, he had "several opportunities to kill the trooper, however, did not because he was a state official and not a federal official." McVeigh talked about how an "action had to be taken" in response to the 1994 assault weapons ban. Ninety minutes after the explosion, a decorated Gulf War veteran named Timothy McVeigh was arrested in northern Oklahoma following a routine traffic stop. It took FBI agents two days to link McVeigh to the bombing, but when they did, McVeigh was immediately branded a "coward." Unfortunately for the FBI, the coward label was a complete misnomer. As Dan Herbeck and Lou Michel explain in their magnificent book "American Terrorist," McVeigh was a lot of things, but he certainly wasn't a coward.

The Oklahoma City bombing is one of the first major news events I can remember hearing about as a kid; although I couldn't appreciate its brutality then, I knew from the look of horror on adults' faces as they took in the scene that it was serious. The bomber, I was told, was crazy. This was an act of violence perpetuated by a crazy person. *American Terrorist* is the biography of Timothy McVeigh, an All-American boy broken by war and twisted by hate to become the monster he loathed and thought he was fighting. Instead, the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum will offer a pre-recorded video that will air online and on TV and will include the reading of the names of everyone killed followed by 168 seconds of silence.

Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City was destroyed by the explosion of a 7,000-pound truck bomb. One-hundred and sixty-eight people, including nineteen children, were killed by the blast, and more than five hundred others were injured. Timothy J. McVeigh, an anti-government activist, was tried, convicted of the bombing and executed on June 11, 2001. But to Americans everywhere, the story has remained a mystery, held hostage by McVeigh's refusal to explain or even discuss the event and his involvement.
