## **TEACHING**

Jack Shainman Gallery is a contemporary art gallery in New York City. The gallery was founded by Jack Shainman and Claude Simard (1956–2014) in 1984 in Washington, D.C. The gallery has a focus on artists from Africa, East Asia, and North America. The gallery opened an exhibition space called The School in Kinderhook, New York in 2018. Jack Shainman has taken a former Colonial Revival schoolhouse and restored it into the perfect New York City gallery space, except that it's in a twee Hudson Valley village better known for Federal architecture than contemporary art. The interior has been perfectly painted with white walls and pale grey floors. "Jack's a mensch." Shainman tries to downplay the nice-guy reputation in a gallery world he likens to a river teeming with piranha. "Maybe that's not good for my brand," he frets. "Sometimes people think if you're nice, you're a pushover."
