Now, to push the baby horizontally, here come the commands for Valsalva pushing and the "triple push pattern" of voluntary maternal force generation (typically bearing down just before, during, and just after peak contraction force). When left to spontaneous pushing, the expulsion phase is sometimes longer, but the natural timing of "pushing" with peak contraction seems to align itself more naturally and results maximal force generation and energy conservation -- basically MOM having a greater amount of energy to get the job done while keeping her pelvic organs and muscles intact. By thinking about these biomechanical processes during IVF treatments, we can help physicians, and prospective parents, see better outcomes, he says.
